With this disruption, my Councillor colleagues offered me the chance to remain as Mayor for another year which I have enjoyed greatly and which concludes in May when we have full Town Council elections.

This year has seen us reshape the way our Council operates and start to lay the ground work for redeveloping the Regal, refurbishing the Town Hall and supporting the Bull Croft Working Party to build an exciting new play area, pavilion and steps/bridges that protect our historic ramparts in the Bull Croft.

In the last 18 months the new Town Clerk has reorganised and built an amazing team to work on Community, Tourism, Business Development, Parks & Estates, Meetings, Grant Applications, Administration, Finance, Events, Town Information and a lot more. I hope in 2023 you will find us even more open to conversations about how this town progresses, celebrates, works and plays.

There are elections in May next year and we are keen to attract a good selection of residents to stand for office. If you have a view on how this town should be run or how we spend your money then why not come along and see what it's all about?

Town Council is a purely voluntary, non-political group of residents who give a minimum of one Monday a month to town matters, although there is a lot more to do if anyone fancies a challenge. High Steward of Wallingford's Award for Community Service

As High Steward of Wallingford I am delighted to request nominations for an award that recognise the outstanding contribution made by an individual or an organisation in establishing, maintaining and promoting the highest standards of community service in Wallingford.



The individual or organisation must be able to demonstrate that they have made an outstanding contribution which benefits residents and the community of Wallingford. They need not themselves live or be based in Wallingford, but the benefit from their work should be shown for a sustained period in the town. Nominations should describe how the nominee has addressed values such as (but not exclusively); helping the disadvantaged, promoting inclusivity and participation in community life, and supporting Wallingford as a town which encourages vibrant community activities.

Nominations should, as far as possible, be from a member of the public independent of the person/organisation being nominated, but where this is not practicable, the person making the nomination must make clear their relationship to the nominee. Self-nominations are not allowed. A nomination statement should be no longer than 500 words and may contain referees. Where referees are included, it is the responsibility of the person making the nomination to ensure that permission has been obtained from the referees for them to be contacted.

Nominations should be posted to the **Town Council at 8a Castle Street, Wallingford OX10 8D**L or sent by email to **senioradmin@wallingfordtowncouncil.gov.uk**, In both cases they should be clearly marked **'For the attention of the High Steward'**.

This is an annual award. For the 2022 award, nominations are requested by Monday 3rd April 2023 and the winner will be notified by Tuesday 2nd May 2023.

Sign up for low-cost broadband - Citizens Advice tip

Citizens Advice Henley has expressed concern that people in need are not taking advantage of cheap broadband and mobile phone schemes set up specially to help them.

Loosely termed "social tariffs" or "essential broadband", these schemes are discounted deals intended for those on Universal Credit, Pension Credit, Employment and Support Allowance, and some other benefits.

Statistics show that only 1.2% of those eligible to register for these low tariffs have done so, although they could save over £100 a year.

Social tariffs are provided in the same way as normal phone and Internet packages, but at a lower price. Network providers liaise with the Department of Work and Pensions (DWP) to ascertain customers' eligibility, and the DWP is required to provide only the necessary information, so that personal information remains safe.

At the time of writing, not all telecom companies offer social tariffs but it is possible for those who qualify to switch to a supplier that does provide them. The usual fees for switching contracts, leaving a contract early or terminating them have in many cases been scrapped for those on benefits who qualify for these tariffs – but check with your supplier to make sure.







WALLINGFORD VOLUNTEER DRIVERS

We urgently need more volunteer drivers - could you help? Could you start the New Year by becoming one of our volunteer drivers?

At present we are concentrating solely on medical appointments for clients who are unable to use public transport and don't have access to personal transport. Most of our journeys are to Oxford, Reading and Wallingford Community Hospital and medical practice. For the past few months we have also been taking people to other hospitals in Oxfordshire and Berkshire because, in their efforts to catch up with the backlog of treatments, the NHS has started holding additional clinics in other medical facilities in both counties.

As a volunteer driver you will be asked to drive a client to their medical appointment, stay with them for the duration of their appointment and take them home. We don't ask volunteers for a regular commitment and there will be no pressure to take on a particular drive. You will receive a mileage allowance for each journey.



Wallingford Wine of the Month - Château La Brande Bordeaux

February is the shortest month: occasionally frozen, sometimes romantic, but crucially absolutely not Dry January. Not that I'd advocate dry January – drink less but better seems a much happier mantra! In any case, this is the 15th column I've written for Window on Wallingford and to my great shame it's the first red Bordeaux we've featured. Time to right a wrong...

Now, if you don't know Bordeaux, there is a chance it comes with preconceptions: maybe expensive, possibly underwhelming and almost certainly complicated. There are good reasons for this – the region comes with a sense of exclusivity, yet it produces more wine than South Africa. Cabernet Sauvignon in particular needs expert handling and careful winemaking to avoid an excess of tannin and acid.

Some of the wine produced is ultra-expensive, capable of ageing for decades, but increasingly the most regarded are also the preserve of the very wealthy. Alongside these, there is the extraordinarily basic, whose principle selling point is the word Bordeaux on the label, with little else to love. However, Bordeaux is also the birthplace of Merlot, Cabernet Sauvignon, Semillon and (probably) Sauvignon Blanc. Ignoring the extremes, the region produces a stellar range of white, red, rosé and sweet wines, and the great majority of them are reliable and very reasonably priced.

One such wine is the Château La Brande, a real highlight of the Grape Minds range, and a long-running favourite of mine. Situated in Castillon, just outside the prestigious Grand Crus of St Emilion, it's a long, hilly clay vineyard, rolling south through trees towards the

Dordogne. The sunny aspect, cool soils and mineral-rich soils lend the juice a warm, intense flavour, and the careful, low-intervention winemaking gives complexity and depth to the wine. 12 months in old French oak softens the tannin, giving the wine an appealing approachability. Expect dark fruit flavours, hints of cedar on the nose, mouth-filling complexity and a long, elegant finish.

I love this kind of wine. It's affordable and drinkable enough that you can open it on a whim for a weeknight treat, but it's refined enough to impress at the smartest dinner party. Reliably delicious, sophisticated, but lovable by everybody, it's everything Bordeaux ought to be. Try it now for a wintry treat, or serve with big earthy flavours and find out why Bordeaux holds such a special place in British hearts.


